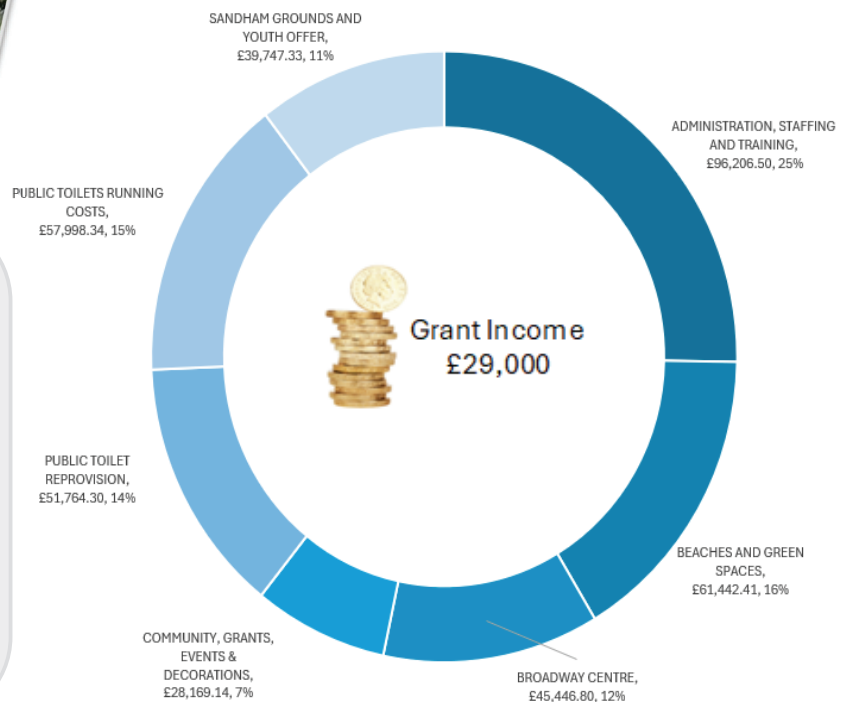

Budget Consultation 2025/2026

Each year the Council must set a balanced budget, which sets out its spending and investment plans and how its services will be funded. The budget must also take account of new cost pressures as well as making sure all its services are as efficient as possible.

The Council's budget setting process is happening now, and residents' views are vital ahead of key decisions being taken.

The costs provided in the questions are estimated on annual costs for a Band D property. Every £1,000 budgeted is £0.41p of the Sandown Town Council portion of council tax per household.

The draft budget will be presented to the meeting of the Town Council on Monday, 18 November 2024. The budget will be finalised at the meeting of the Town Council on Monday, 10 February 2025.

The Council serves your community so be sure to have your say.

1. COUNCIL'S PRIORITIES

2. COMMUNICATION

The council thinks about how it communicates with residents on an ongoing basis. 3. WARM SPACES AND COMMUNITY WELLBEING INITIATIVES

The reduction of Government support with Fuel Costs will significantly impact on the residents of Sandown. Warm spaces have also served to reduce isolation within the community and are now run all year.

The local Warm Space is currently funded via Grant Funding from Connect for Communities and is not Guaranteed. Do you support the Council budgeting to build a fund to support the Sandown Warm Space should the Grant be withdrawn.

4. PLANNING

Planning is a statutory function and therefore not in the Town Council's gift. In 2024/25 the Town Council contributes towards additional resource in Sandown leading to four times more enforcement activity.

8. SANDHAM GROUNDS

Sandown Town Council provides and maintains the equipment in Sandham Grounds. To ensure the continued provision of the Multi Use Games Area, Rainbow Park and Skate Park it is important the council budgets for ongoing maintenance and builds reserves to replace equipment and secure match funding where possible. 9. PLACE AND TOWN IMPROVEMENTS

The Council has a budget for town improvements which it uses to install and maintain defibrillators, supporting “in bloom” and community activities and projects (such as repainting the railings) as well as delivering projects supporting the Bay Place Plan and regeneration. If the monies are not spent, they are allocated to Civic Space budget lines or carried forward into the next year.
